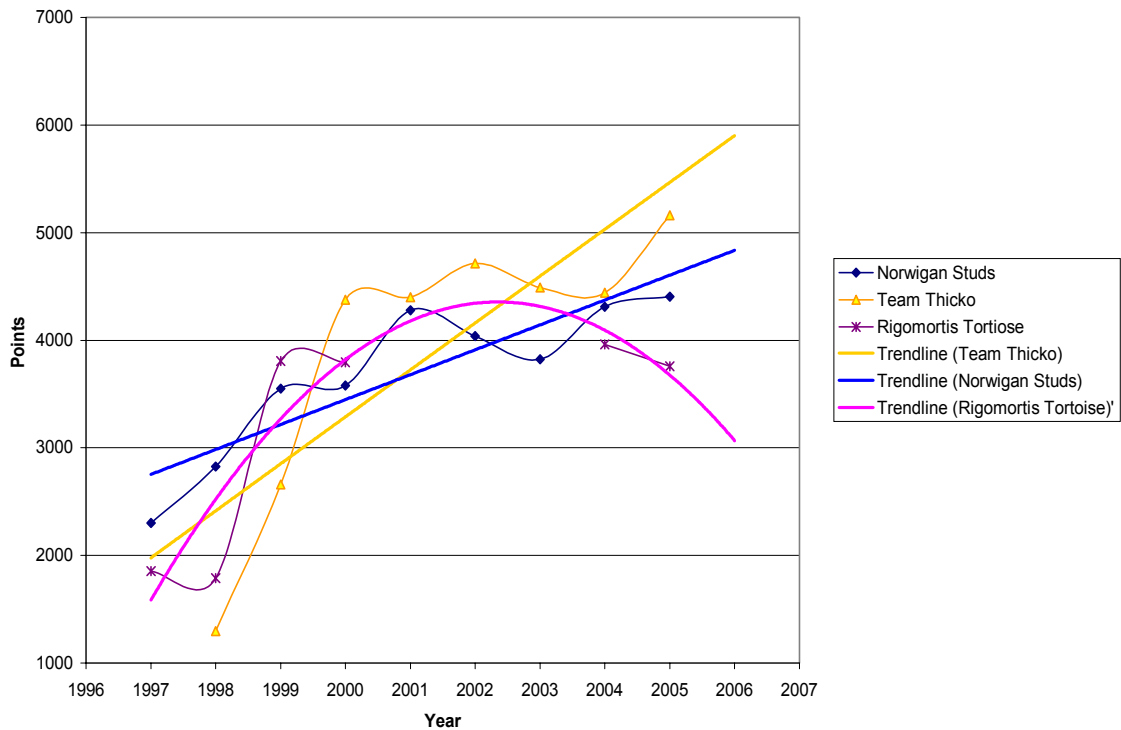

This shows the last 9 years of team point values for Norwigan Studs (blue), Team Thicko (yellow), and Rigomortis Tortoise (Purple), along with their corresponding trendlines. Predictions for 2006 are 4800 points for us, 5900 points for thicko, and unfortunately only 3000 points for the tortoise. We can also expect about a mid-fifties finish, compared to a thirties finish for thicko. Just to raise our hopes, the tortoise is projected to finish about 160<sup>th</sup>. I thought this might be exciting news we'd like to hear about.

Well, I think I've probably rambled on for long enough now. In the words of the ever popular Andrew Jackson, "There is no pleasure in having nothing to do; the fun is having lots to do and not doing it."
